## How to evaluate students



## **READING**

Can read all texts with optimum level of comprehension and does not differ from a native speaker of the language Can read all texts and has a high level of comprehension with no assistance and differs from a native speaker only in a slower reading pace and adapting to reading more unusual texts. Still uses foreign language frequently Can read all texts with a high level of comprehension, and requires minimal assistance, 5 yet noticeably slower at reading than a native speaker Can read moderately difficult texts with a satisfactory comprehension level, yet still has a 4 slow reading pace and needs some assistance of a dictionary 3 Can minimally comprehend a topic of conversation and can read at a slow pace Can identify a topic of conversation and can read several public signs 2 Knows letters of the alphabet and a few simple public signs 1



## **WRITING**

Can write in the same manner as that of an educated native speaker, and does so frequently

Completely competent of writing in language with no need for a dictionary. Is still distinguishable from a native speaker

Can write longer texts, with limited dependency on a dictionary and a few grammatical errors.

Can write a few simple paragraphs, with some dependency on a dictionary

Can write a simple paragraph, with dependency on a dictionary

Can write a simple sentence

Can write letters and words by copying



## **SPEAKING**

Speaks language fluently with no errors, and is the level usually only achieved by a native speaker, or someone who has lived in language a long time
Able to have more in-depth conversation with great confidence, and still has a minor accent
Can have a conversation with a native speaker with minor errors and needs some clarification
Can have a simple conversation with a native speaker with fewer errors
Can form a simple sentence and has a very limited vocabulary
Can say some simple, memorized sentences and needs frequent grammatical correction
Can say a simple greeting, but is understood with difficulty
